



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
# HOW BUSY WERE WE?

- × The Department received 16,830 citizen calls for service in 2012 of which 1,840 were 911 calls. This is a decrease from last year from 18,184 calls.
- × Officer generated calls totaled 7,942 which consisted of traffic stops, suspicious person/vehicles, foot patrol, traffic details and motorist assists, house checks, investigations and premise exams.

# PART I CRIME DEFINITIONS

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## Robbery

In the course of committing theft a person causes or threatens to cause injury or death.

## Aggravated Assault

Causes serious bodily injury to another person including the person's spouse; or uses or exhibits a deadly weapon during the commission of the assault.

## Burglary

Enters a habitation or building not open to the public with the intent to commit a felony, theft or assault.

## Burglary of Vehicle

Break into or enter a vehicle or any part of a vehicle with intent to commit a felony or theft.

## Theft / Auto Theft


Unlawfully appropriates property without the owner's consent with the intent to deprive the owner of the property.







# ROBBERY

- Robbery increased by two this year compared to year 2011.
- Suspect jumped from buses and attempted to steal bicycle on Allena
- Subject punched victim and demanded wallet at Kate Baker Park
- Subjects were robbed at gun point on Cagle for guns
- Suspect attempted to rob victim at drive-up ATM at Wells Fargo – Victim drove off



# AGGRAVATED ASSAULT

## Aggravated Assault

- Aggravated assaults decreased by one as we experienced 7 this year as opposed to 8 last year.
- There were (4) assaults involving the use of other weapons and (3) were with a knife.

# RESIDENTIAL VS. BUSINESS


- Residential burglary made up about 41% of all burglaries with a total of 23. (18) Residential burglaries occurred during the day and (7) during the night. Force was used on 15 occasions to gain entry as opposed to 32 last year. Entry usually through the front door.
- Non-residential burglaries made up 58% of all burglaries with a total of 34. (6) of them occurred during the day and (29) were committed at night. Force or attempted force was used to gain entry on 30 occasions.
- The city experienced a decrease in the overall number of burglaries in 2012.

# THEFTS

- Thefts decreased by 1.6% this year.
- Force was used in 10 of the 59 vehicle burglaries.
- Thefts are responsible for 32% of the total amount of stolen property amounting to (\$539,705) this year.



# AUTO THEFTS

- There were a total of 25 Vehicle thefts which is a decrease from 34 in 2011.
- There were 10 stolen trucks which included (2) Fords, (7) Chevrolets, and (1) Toyota. Most common model was the Chevrolet 1500.
- There were 7 automobiles taken during 2012 and all were of a different make or model.
- There were 9 other vehicles consisting of 5 trailers, 2 Motorcycles, and 2 boats.


## Auto Thefts



Total dollar amount of auto thefts account for \$199,323. This is 38% of the total amount of stolen property in 2012.

# STOLEN PROPERTY BY MONTH

Stolen property decreased this year from \$832,768 to \$529,705. The peak months for stolen property were Apr and Jun. The decrease is because there were 2 very large thefts last year which drove up the totals for 2011.




# ADULT ARREST COMPARISON

Total 300 Arrests





## ADULT ARRESTS BY RACE & ETHNICITY


# JUVENILE DETENTIONS

There were a total of 27 juveniles detained during 2012. 13 year olds accounted for a majority of the detentions.


This amounts to a 42% increase in the number of juveniles detained in 2012 from 19 last year.



# JUVENILE DETENTIONS BY CLASSIFICATION




# ACCIDENTS INVESTIGATED




- The department responded to 158 accident calls in 2012 which is a 23% decrease from 207 in 2011.
