**Do you want to help your local police department solve crimes in your neighborhood?**

If so, then join **C.A.P.T.I.V.E**, Citizens Assisting Police Through Investigative Video Evidence, and provide us with your contact information. When a crime occurs in your neighborhood we can contact you and have you check your cameras for evidence of a crime.

## What is C.A.P.T.I.V.E?

It is a program designed to utilize privately owned security cameras that could contain video evidence in an area of a recent crime. Video evidence is a crucial part in identifying, apprehending, and convicting criminals responsible for criminal activity. By joining **C.A.P.T.I.V.E**, you give the police department one more tool to help bring criminals to justice!



## How does it work?

- 1) A crime occurs in your neighborhood...
- 2) A police officer responds to the call to investigate the crime...
- 3) The police officer opens the **C.A.P.T.I.V.E** database. It shows a nearby neighbor has enrolled and is willing to be contacted about possibly having video evidence.
- 4) The police officer contacts the owner of the security cameras to research the time period the crime occurred.
- 5) If the video is helpful, then the police officer will request a copy of the video from the camera owner.
- 6) The useful camera footage is included with the police report, and could help bring the suspect to justice.
